I want to begin by thanking you all for making our anniversary event so memorable. Jonathan Edwards wrote to me thanking us all for the welcome he received and the way we engaged with what he said.

Jonathan reminded us about how we need to proclaim the Gospel, explain the story of Jesus and be open to being changed by the Holy Spirit. Jesus through his death and resurrection made a way for us to be forgiven from our sins and enjoy life forever with him. This message is the foundation for all we do. But we live in an age when the Church is declining, and it is tempting to lose our faith in what we believe in, or in the power of God to change the situation. It is tempting to adopt the methods of salesmen to stem the decline. At best you may get short term results. At worst you lose all sense of integrity.

Whilst I was preparing for the A.G.M., I was reminded of some values I laid down while I was in Plymouth concerning how I and the Church should conduct ministry today and they will help to build a healthy Church. I think these values are transferable and so I list them below:

#### 1. Reliable, biblical teaching.

Studying the word helps us to know what God wants us to do and how to do it. It lays a strong foundation for life and faith.

#### 2. Renewed by the Spirit.

We need to pray and seek the Spirit's power to achieve anything.

#### 3. Relevant language.

The Gospel and Bible truth never changes, but the language we use to explain it does. People don't know what the Bible teaches anymore so we need to find ways to tell that story in ways people can understand.

#### 4. Relational ethos.

Faith is about our relationship with God. Church life is about love for one another and deep friendships. We need ways to continue to foster this great gift we already have.

#### 5. Finally, Reaching out.

I believe we can no longer expect folks to just come to us. We need to be at work in our communities, getting connected with the life of the town and bringing something of the presence of God to life here.

I intend to expand on these more in a teaching series in the autumn so watch this space.
